Give thanks to him and bless his name. For the Lord is good, and his faithful love endures forever; his faithfulness, through all generations.

(Psalm 100:4b-5)

I have two things for you this month: An invitation and a Thanksgiving prayer.

An Invitation: On Sunday, November 11th, the Session invites you to worship at 8:45 or 11 a.m., a 10 a.m. seminar, and a 7 p.m. concert and hymn sing. Christian musician and songwriter Jeremy Casella will be with us that morning and evening to lead us in praise to the Lord. At 10 a.m., he will present a seminar called *Why We Still Need Hymns*. There is a movement among worship leaders that is reviving a return to the singing and composition of hymns that carry biblical truths about the person and character of God. For our church, hymns can be a uniting element of our two different worship services. I hope that you take a cue from your elders and make this day a priority for yourself and for our church family.


Jeremy Casella is coming to FPCB on November 11

November 18 and 25 - "Word-Share-Prayer"

Word-Share-Prayer is a format for a Bible study and reflection in a small group or meeting setting. This downloadable resource from Vital Churches Institute is free and contains 80 suggestions for Bible studies along with handouts to guide each discussion. http://vitalchurchesinstitute.com/pages/word-share-prayer.

The texts for this study and reflection are a bit short so that those with limited time can still "be the people of God before doing the work of the people of God." For small group meetings, a longer section of text may be used or just more time spent discussing each segment.

- 1. Give every person 5-7 minutes to work on it in silence.
- 2. Spend another 7 minutes or so asking people to briefly share one insight from their paper. If the group is larger than 14, you can have them break into 4's to save time.
- 3. Ask for one-sentence prayer requests. Spend more time on this if someone in the group is in real distress about something. Otherwise, just a sentence or so per person as we want to lift one another up but haven't the time for more sharing... unless we are willing. Teams are often willing to spend more time in this Bible study portion of the meeting simply because we will work to be more efficient in the rest of the meeting.

Pray for one another out loud by name, giving everyone the complete freedom to pray in silence if they prefer.

In November, we will be learning to use this Bible study and reflection technique. Join us at 10 a.m. in Fellowship Hall.

Honduras Hope Mission Team

(Collection Dates for Medical Items: November 4, 11 & 18)

The Honduras Hope Mission Team needs the help of the congregation as we prepare for our February 2-10, 2019 Mission Trip. Items may be placed in the donation box at the church entrance on the following Sundays: November 4, 11 & 18. During the week, they can be dropped off in the office.

<u>Needed</u>: Acetaminophen (Tylenol or any brand); Ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil, etc.); Calcium supplements; 81 mg. Aspirin; Benadryl (adult or children); Antacid tablets of any kind; Prenatal vitamins; Iron supplements; Antibiotic creams (such as Neosporin); Antifungal creams (such as Clotrimazole); Hydrocortisone cream; Cough or cold remedies; Soap; Toothpaste; Toothbrushes (individually packaged); Mouthwash (travel size bottles); Dental picks/dental floss; Shampoo; Band-Aids (any and all sizes); Washcloths; Canes (any type & size); Ace wraps (2", 3", or 4" size); Athletic tape (1" or 2" adhesive tape); Wrist supports (especially for right hand); Ankle supports (elastic or cloth supports; no immobilizers or cast boots); Knee supports (no immobilizers).

THEN plan to come to Fellowship Hall on Sunday, November 18 at 6:30 p.m. and work together to consolidate all the meds and supplies to prepare them for the trip to Honduras!
